Ergonomics Project Phase One Completed

MTF has just completed a self-funded, 18-month ergonomics study to aid in the creation of a best-practices model for workplace safety and techniques for massage therapists.

MTF's inquiry, investigation, data collection, and research garnered from this study will make a significant contribution to the health and longevity of massage therapy professionals and benefit practitioners, practice settings, and schools.
